Mental Health Support

Okemos Public Schools has partnered with Child and Family Charities to provide a mental health clinic within Okemos High School. This opportunity is made possible because of the Expanding, Enhancing Emotional Health (E3) grant through the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Adolescent Health Center Division.

The clinic will provide on-site comprehensive mental health services from mild to moderate severity of need.

There will be a full-time therapist at the OHS clinic five days a week and will be able to serve all OPS youth ages

Indigenous Peoples' Day & Columbus Day
October 10, 2022

From "Rethinking How We Celebrate American History: Indigenous Peoples' Day" (Smithsonian Magazine, October 2020): The first documented observance of Columbus Day in the United States took place in New York City in 1792, and the holiday began as an annual celebration of Italian-American heritage in San Francisco in 1869. Celebrating Columbus is problematic for many Indigenous Americans, however. Colonization in the United States started with Columbus and led to the deaths of millions of Indigenous Americans, while those who survived were forced to assimilate. In 1977, it was proposed at the United Nations that Indigenous Peoples' Day replace Columbus Day. Indigenous Peoples' Day recognizes the authentic history of Indigenous Americans, their resilience, and their diverse culture. Columbus Day is still a federal holiday.
