4th Grade Move Up Day at Kinawa

The highly anticipated 4th Grade Move-up Day is scheduled for **May 23rd** and we want to be sure that everyone has the necessary information as this event is quickly approaching!

We have coordinated with the transportation department and buses are scheduled to arrive at elementary buildings between 8:50 - 9:00am to pick up students. All students will arrive at Kinawa around 9:15 and will head to our Auditorium to be welcomed by Kinawa staff. Students will then move through various rotations before experiencing a Kinawa lunch and recess.

Students will need to bring their lunch (these will be placed in baskets for the morning hours) or students may purchase a lunch for \$3.50 (cash or school lunch account used at their elementary school). Lunch entrees will be Lasagna Roll Ups (V), Breadsticks, or California Blend Veggies. Elementary teachers will communicate a lunch count to Kinawa upon arrival.

All 4th grade students and staff will board the buses at 12:15pm to return to the elementary buildings.
