#### **High School Football Expectations**

To maintain a SAFE and orderly environment at our sporting events, so that ALL fans can enjoy the games, we are asking parents/guardians to please help us in our effort by reviewing these expectations with their students before they attend a game. Students who choose to demonstrate unsafe behaviors will be asked to sit with their caregivers.

- All students through 8th grade must have an adult present with them to attend the game.
- Students are expected to stay within the event boundaries. At high school football games students must stay within the event boundaries defined by fences. Specifically, students are not permitted to jump fences to access the soccer field, be under the bleachers, or enter Hartrick Park.
- Always exhibit good sportsmanship:
- -Be respectful during the National Anthem, school songs, and player introductions.
- -Never boo or yell at officials or opposing players.
- -Cheer for your team's players.
- -Represent your school in a positive manner.
- -Be respectful of other students and adults attending the game.

#### **DEI Tidbits**

National Hispanic Heritage Month is celebrated from September 15 to October 15. The terms "Hispanic" and "Latino" have different meanings. "Hispanic" refers to someone who comes from or is a descendant of a Spanish-speaking country. "Latina" or "Latino" (or the gender-neutral, "Latinx") refers to someone who comes from Latin America or is a descendant of any Latin American country. Latin America consists of the entire continent of South America in addition to Mexico, Central America, and the islands of the Caribbean.

The Anishinaabe in Michigan

Michigan's three largest Native American tribes are the Ojibwe (also called Chippewa), the Odawa (also called Ottawa), and the Potawatomi (also called the Bode'wadmi). They share a common language, customs, and beliefs. Together, they are Anishinaabe, or "original people." Hundreds of years ago, they created a partnership called the Three Fires. The Ojibwe were the "keepers of the ceremonies and song," the Odawa were "keepers of the trade," and the Potawatomi were the "keepers of the fire."

#### **Mental Health Support**

Okemos Public Schools has partnered with Child and Family Charities to provide a mental health clinic within Okemos High School. This opportunity is made possible because of the Expanding, Enhancing Emotional Health (E3) grant through the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Adolescent Health Center Division. The clinic will provide on-site comprehensive mental health services from mild to moderate severity of need. There will be a full-time therapist at the OHS clinic five days a week and will be able to serve all OPS youth ages 5 to 21 years.
