

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Culturally Responsive Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports

What is Empathy?

Empathy is the ability to communicate and lead by understanding the thoughts, views and feelings of others. As we know, no two people share the same thoughts. Our thoughts and experiences play a huge role in how we see the outside world. In order to truly understand another person, we need to understand their thoughts, feelings and experiences.

Everyone practices empathy in one way or another. If we are paying attention to what other people are saying, we are empathizing with them. We become involved in their feelings and thoughts in order to better understand who they are and what they want or need. We can respond appropriately to what they are saying.

What does it look like in school?

Listening: The key for developing empathy

Better listening leads to:

- better understanding of people
- fewer mistakes and misunderstandings
- a chance to learn more
- better ability to work together

Some strategies we use at school to foster empathy are:

morning meetings, restorative practices, PBIS and Social-Emotional lessons, read aloud, teaching students that our differences make us unique and special.

How can you help at home?

- MODEL EMPATHY toward others yourself, including for people who are different from you.
- Help your children understand that the world doesn't revolve around them. It's vital at times for parents to put children's concern for others above their happiness. This might mean insisting that your child:
 - step away from screen time to help around the house
 - be polite even when he/she is in a bad mood
 - not dominate the airwaves when they are talking to others
- TRY THIS
 - Have family meetings
 - Encourage empathy for peers
 - Have conversations about tricky situations
 - Reflect on empathy and caring regularly with your child




