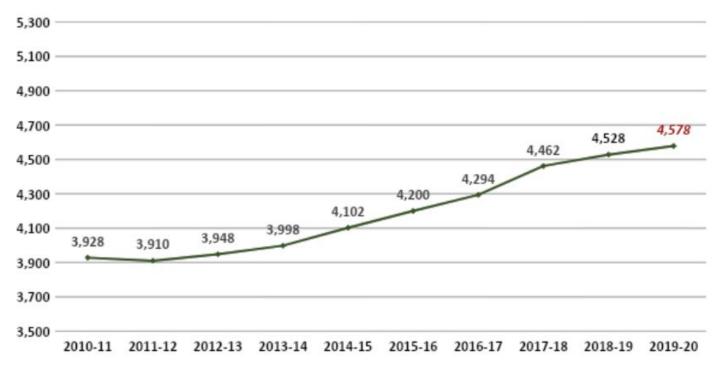

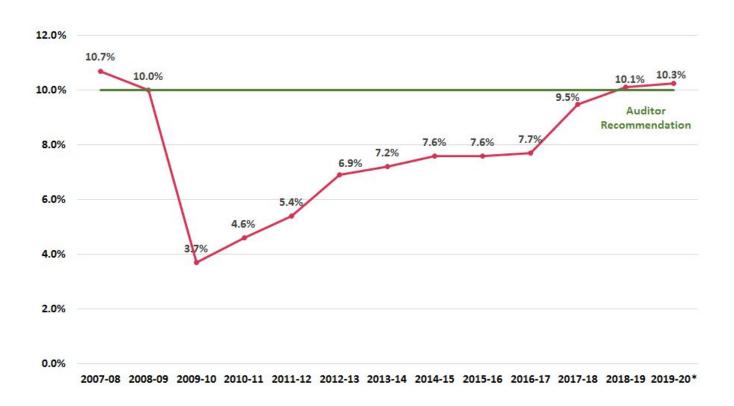

Transportation



• Bus fleet consists of: 16 route buses and 5 spare/additional buses.

The 2019 Bond funded the purchase of 13 new replacement school busses over the next five years.

• District transportation is provided to students who live greater than 1.5 miles to their school, per board policy.

• Transportation completes 31 Secondary (7-12) routes and 31 Elementary (K-6) routes per school day.

And in addition the district regularly transports:

- 2 After school "Champs" routes, 1 Special needs route, 2 Summer academic routes,
- Plus hundreds of classroom, athletic, music and senior center trips, which occur throughout the year.

Technology



- Supports "1 to 1" student devices K-12
- Infrastructure maintenance and updates:
 - o devices, wireless, storage servers, firewall, filter, phone system, core routers/switches
