FROM DR. LARA SLEE, DIRECTOR of DEI

Diwali is a five-day New Year festival that is celebrated by Hindus, Jains, Sikhs, and some Buddhists, and it is India's biggest holiday of the year. It is based on the lunar calendar, so it can occur any time from mid-October to mid-November. This year, Diwali takes place November 9-14. The name comes from the Sanskrit word Dipavali, which means series of lights. Diwali signifies the victory of good over evil (light over darkness, hope over despair, and knowledge over ignorance). The holiday is commonly celebrated by the lighting of lamps and fireworks, cleaning and redecorating the home, gift-giving, feasts, street processions, and fairs. LEARNING FROM A MISTAKE: I made a mistake. One of the last DEI tidbits included information about government- and church-run boarding schools in which Native American students were grossly mistreated. They were taken from their families, forced to adopt new names, physically and emotionally abused, prohibited from honoring their spiritual beliefs, and not allowed to speak their own languages. By providing you with a short description of athlete Jim Thorpe without providing any context about the boarding schools, I neglected to give you the full story, nor did I show an authentic appreciation of Native American heritage. This shows a lack of empathy and understanding on my part, which are things I'll be working on. Native American Heritage Month should be a celebration of music, art, stories, and culture rather than a focus on how people have been forced to endure oppression.

The <u>Native American Heritage Month website</u> has exhibits and collections that truly honor and celebrate Native American culture, such as <u>Keeping Our Words Alive (Smithsonian)</u>, <u>Legacies of Service:</u> <u>Celebrating Native Americans</u> (Veterans History Project) and <u>Why</u> <u>Treaties Matter: Self-Government in the Dakota and Ojibwe Nations</u>, among many others. I will be exploring these resources as I develop my understanding of Native American heritage, and I encourage you to do the same.
