The board reviewed the recommendation for School of Choice openings to be advertised 18-19 through the Ingham Intermediate School District for the 2018-2019 school year. The School of Choice proposed openings are as follows: 1 opening per grade level. Openings Discussion: The board discussed the placement of the Technology, Security, Transportation, Capital Outlay, and Facilities bond and/or millage on the November 2018 and/or May Bond/Millage 2019 ballot. Members discussed the advantages of funding through a bond vs. a millage; and the criteria set by each funding source. The board agreed that a May, 2019 election timeline would be ideal for adequately preparing. Assistant Superintendent John Hood presented the new textbook recommendations for Textbook 2018-2019. Mr. Hood also reviewed the process for developing the recommendations. Recommendations It is not assumed that funds will be available in the general fund to purchase textbooks. The recommendations include: U.S. History; AP Biology; American Literature; Functions, Systems & Trigonometry; Algebra II; AP Statistics; Geometry; French and K-5 Math. Vincent Lyon-Callo inquired about the novel recommended for American Literature; as well as the guidelines for identifying bias in curriculum and materials. Finance Director Elizabeth Lentz provided information regarding textbook budgeting Textbook and the ability to expense the cost of the K-5 math program and the accompanying Budgeting consumables over the next eight years or the possibility of setting aside funds for future year purchases. The benefits and the challenges of each method were described. Finance Director Elizabeth Lentz provided an update and the board continued 2018-2019 discussing the development of the 2018-2019 budget. An updated comparison of State Budget Aid Proposals from the State was provided. Vincent Lyon-Callo inquired about budget priorities and the process used to determine which to implement. Several items will be brought for discussion at each of the May meetings. **Comments From** Jennifer Davis and Scott Schopieray encouraged the board to pursue a November The Public election.
