The board discussed a resolution in support of the governor's proposed budget, as well as encouraging legislators to establish a state budget in a timely manner. Minor revisions were suggested. The board will vote on this resolution at its April 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting.

Discussion: Resolution – State Budget The board continued their discussion regarding the development of the 2019-2020 budget. Several budget updates were provided including revised timelines, the impact of the bond on the budget, an 18-19 budget revision, and updated 19-20 assumptions. Multiple sources indicate that the State will not have a budget in place before June 30<sup>th</sup> when the district is required to adopt a budget. Because of this, more conservative preliminary budget assumptions were provided and included: increased childcare revenue; confirmed health insurance rates; and increased substitute teacher rates. At this time, the "most likely" projections result in an approximate positive impact on the general fund of \$281,370. Impending budget items were reviewed and included: staffing needs, negotiations, booster support etc. PAGE 8686

18-19 Revision

The board discussed the impact of the May 7<sup>th</sup> bond election on the budget, comparing the impact if it passes with if it doesn't pass. Areas most affected include transportation, personal learning devices and the phone system. These items would impact the 19-20 general fund budget. Other projects could be moved to the sinking fund, while others would be cancelled or scaled back if the bond does not pass. The projected impact if the bond does not pass ranges from \$569,000 to \$1,659,000.

The board also discussed a 2018-2019 budget revisions including but not limited to increased expenses in athletics and staffing, and increased special education revenue. The carry forward effect on the general fund is an approximate positive impact on the general fund of \$366,023.

Member inquired about the "unknowns" and suggested additional meetings as these items are resolved. In addition, members inquired about the process used by a department to increase their budget without coming to the board first; timelines for high school devices; selection process for devices; and transportation needs.
