<u> Chippewa – Karen Shapiro</u>

- Curriculum night was Thursday, September 7. Parents enjoyed following their child's schedule and meeting with all of their teachers.
- Friday, September 15 First CMS Parent Group Meeting, 8:30 9:30 a.m.
- The Chippewa Walk/Run is a 3.8 mile route which all of the students and teachers participate in. It will take place on September 29^{th,} beginning at 1:15pm. Delta Dental donated bottles of water for this event.
- The second of three donation collections takes place Friday, September 15th for the 2017 for the Chippewa Walk/Run. Our goal is to raise \$16,000 for Chippewa Middle School! This is the ONLY fundraiser the Chippewa Parent Group sponsors all year, and the funds raised pay for field trips, learning materials, classroom equipment, library books, school-wide events, teacher wish lists, and more. We are at about 20% of our goal as of the morning of 9/15. Classes who reach 85% class donations will receive a \$50 gift card. If the school reaches its goal there will be an ice cream party. <u> Kinawa – Andi Pincheira and Sarah Finley</u>

- **Keep Kinawa Moving** This year's Keep Kinawa Moving event will be held on September 26th! This is Kinawa's primary fundraising event for the school year. It takes many volunteers to orchestrate such a large event. We will be sending out information on Wednesday about the event as well as information for anyone who may be willing to volunteer.
- New faces around Kinawa this year Kinawa is excited to welcome some new faces to our building. Please welcome Mr. Casey Bissot, Ms. Lauren Dombek, Mrs. Sheree Jungwirth, and Ms. Britney Page to the Kinawa family. Mr. Bissott will be teaching 6th grade Science and Social Studies. Ms. Dombek will be teaching 6th grade Math and Science. Mrs. Jungwirth will be teaching Exploratory and Physical Education. Ms. Page will be a new Special Education teacher for Kinawa. We are very excited about the experience and enthusiasm they bring to our building.
- **Clubs at Kinawa** Cross Country Club is up and running. Currently Kinawa has between 170 students participating in Cross Country Club. Cross Country Club meets every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 3:45 pm 4:45 pm. Archery Club information will be sent out the week of September 18th, with the club beginning the first week in October.
- **PTO Meeting** Kinawa will be having its first PTO meeting on Wednesday September 20th at 7pm in the Kinawa library. The primary goal of the meeting will be to provide an overview of Google Classroom for parents. Google Classroom is a resource that all Kinawa teachers regularly use for their students. We would like to use this opportunity to help familiarize parents of this resource.

<u> Cornell – Sarah Allen and Melissa Cochran</u>

- Cornell's enrollment is 436, which is slightly higher than last year at this time. We have 19 classrooms (4 of every grade except 3 fourth grade classes.)
- We added a fourth school bus this year to accommodate the larger enrollments in busable areas. Cornell could benefit from having a bus driveway that is separate from the carline. Parents have been patient and carline is running as smoothly as possible given the large volume of cars and buses together.
- PTO will be having our annual Cougar Run fundraiser on Friday, October 20th.
- Cornell will have two clubs this year: Chieftain Champs (funded by OEF) and Tech Club (funded by PTO). We also have safety patrol and student council.

<u> OPM – Kristin Arnett and Heather Moeser</u>

- Last Spring, every child participated and painted part of the new murals that were installed just before school started. The artist who helped with the project was **Kelly Boyle**.
- Our annual Flash Dash fundraising fun run (last spring) raised over \$30,000 this year. The funds go towards extra teacher stipends, off sets the cost of field trips and clubs, purchase additional Montessori classroom materials, and one large school project. The current goal is to have a beautification of the school grounds including gardens and a walking/running track. This summer the front entrance was improved with landscaping. We are planning on additional improvements in phases for the other areas of the school grounds.
- Lockdown drills were completed this week.
- The PTO is sponsoring a Family Fun Morning on Saturday November 18th at Spare Time from 9:00 11:00. This will replace the carnival that we have had for the past few years.
- This year the PTO will be alternating evening/daytime meetings every month the next PTO meeting is 9/18 6:30 PM in the OPM library.
- The OPM PTO sponsors "eat out" events in the area to provide an opportunity for to school community to get together and to help raise money for the school. The 1st event for this school year will be at Old Chicago Pizza & Taproom Sept. 27th.

<u> Bennett Woods – Anu Atre, Jayne Locke</u>

- We have 411 students this year an addition of 36 over last year.
- Parent Family Council meets on second Thursday of each month. All parents are welcome. First meeting was last week and events/committees for the year were planned.
- Bennett Woods was selected to be the beneficiary for Whole Foods Community Give. 5% of sales on Wed, Sep 20 will go to Bennett Woods. Funds will be used for picnic tables in the playground and for flexible seating in the school. Please support BW by shopping at Whole Foods on Wednesday.
- Fun Run on Oct 6 before homecoming parade. Biggest fundraiser of the year. Principal Palasty will dye her hair (students choose color) if we meet school goal of 12,500\$.
