- Really busy with increased security discussion
 - o Locked doors and buzzer systems will cost about \$25,000
 - We can do it in this budget year because of surplus in budget
 - Buzzer system will be school hours only
 - Other additional systems would have to be part of a bond issue in which money wouldn't be ready until 2020
