Superintendent report. Dr. Catherine Ash

- Turf field is complete and unveiling ceremony is this Friday, Sept. 21 at 6:45pm. Donation for the field was made by the Grewal Family in honor of their parents.
- Bus capacity is at 77% and watching four routes as trouble spots and adjusting as needed.
- Studying Chippewa crossing and figuring out how to make it more visible to drivers. Will be getting a sandwich board purchased by road commission as an added way to notify drivers of the crossing ahead. Possibly more signage will be added to educate drivers.
- Enrollments up 71 students from last year and budget was based on 75 student increase. Bennett Woods up 15, Cornell up 44, Hiawatha down 22, Montessori same, Kinawa down 26, Chippewa up 39, High School up 36 students. Added classroom at Cornell.
- Facilities committee looking to address enrollment issues at elementary level. Do not need to deal with capacity at upper building levels. Cornell is the most affected by capacity issues. Committee met and looked at options of adding 4-5 additional classrooms to either Bennett Woods, Central, Cornell or Hiawatha. They looked at re opening 4-5 of the empty classrooms at Wardcliff located in the south wing. They studied all of these options regarding benefits, negatives, cost, etcetera and will put forth a plan to Board. An email will be sent to everyone from Dr. Ash explaining more details with about this issue. Board will decide what recommendation will be on ballot in May. Some security options will come out of this committee as well.
- There is a student out fundraising for Kinawa for furniture and this is not real fundraiser. If you come in contact with this student, please contact the school district.
- Budget audit is available Monday night. Budget is very close to its projections. It is a positive of less than a percent off of what was projected.
- Cornell traffic challenges are being worked on and looking at solutions.
- Security door cameras are up and running. Discussed encouraging kids to say things when they see things. Looking at additional security recommendations which will be brought forward. District uses a balanced approach for security as there is a wide continuum of beliefs about the subject.
- Number of social workers in our buildings are still not at the level as they were prior to budget cuts. Elementary levels are back to the same level. Board will be educated on what different jobs

- responsibilities there are for the various positions, including, psychologist, social worker, and counselor, to help Board prioritize during budget decisions.
- Superintendent search applicants will be given to the Board of Education this week as they were posted through MASB. They are reviewed in closed session on September 24th and will narrow the list and finalize questions. The Board will utilize a local facilitator to assist the Board with a process for sorting and selecting candidates; finalizing questions; managing the interview process; including stakeholder interviews; and decision making. First round interviews are on October 8 and 9 with the Board of Education and second round interviews on October 24 will also include stakeholders. Opportunity for parents will be on October 24 with finalists. New superintendent will be announced at November 12 Board Meeting.
