# Superintendent update - John Hood

- Students back in school
  - $_{\odot}\mbox{We}$  welcomed back the little ones last week
  - $_{\odot}\mbox{The}$  face to face interactions is so good to see
- Legislative
  - $_{\odot}$  Changes came through on March 3
  - $_{\odot}\mbox{Funding}$  is tied to Title I formulations
  - °\$450 minimum per pupil
  - Some districts are getting \$1000s per pupil, Okemos usually gets \$80ish
  - Extended hours to receive this portion of money are required by March 22
  - $_{\odot}$  This is federal money from December 2020 that the states have to figure out how to allocate
  - $_{\odot}$  The BofE met and approved (6-1) an expanded schedule in order to get the \$1.6 million
    - As part of this vote they were having to balance the health and safety right now but also in the future
    - A second option to change a student between in-person and virtual will occur in later April
      - State testing has to be done in person so that affects the April date being later
- Sinking fund campaign
  - $\circ$  Building and site volunteers needed for the VoteYesfor OPS campaign  $\circ$  May 4th election
- Equity survey almost ready to go out
  - $_{\circ}$  Mascot community ready to meet
- Next school year

• At the moment it will only be in-person but the State BofE easily and quickly makes changes that gives the school districts very little time to plan for

- Will likely be allowed to have a virtual option but no plan has been shared yet at all even though a plan has been asked for for quite some time
- Hiring season has started

• At least five are retiring but he thinks there will be more

- Question was asked
  - ${}_{\odot}$  What happens if parents opt out of state testing?

- It affects us if they don't test but we can't require a family to bring their student in during this pandemic to have them do the testing so it's out of our hands if families choose that
- Regarding positive Covid tests in schools
  - He says Covid is in our schools
  - All of the school will be told but for privacy only the ones that may have been in direct contact will be told about a possible contact
- •Vaccine numbers for the teachers?
  - The union feels good about the amount of vaccines that have been taken
  - The district had to help some teachers with the health department to get their appointments
  - Most have the second and some will be finishing their second in the next few weeks
- How are the teachers feeling?
  - So much excitement
  - Some fear
  - The safety features implemented the teachers feel really good about them
  - Still plenty of mixed emotions
  - After being with the kids last week he can see the fulfillment the teachers have been missing
- $\circ$  Food Service hired?
  - Michael Wensel from Swartz Creek will begin March 22
- $_{\odot}$  Human Resource/Inclusion Director will be hired over the summer

School Board Update - Mary Gebara

- Pleased to see Dr. Fauci says maybe three feet rather than six feet is fine for kids because they're smaller
- Recovery committee Mary is on is looking for post-trauma ways to help after Covid
- Sinking fund
  - o Doesn't change the tax amount, it's just a renewal
  - If that doesn't get approved it will affect the district with \$1.3 million less a year that ultimately affects the students

Host School Update - Julie Bellinger - Hiawatha (not present but report sent over)

- Hiawatha was one of the testing locations for the WIDA Test this year. It has been a very successful endeavor. We have approximately 10 students left to assess and we will be able to close the window on this mandated assessment. I would like to extend gratitude to the following team, departments, and staff:
  - Our entire district ELL Team, Assistant Superintendent Bailey, and Stacey Molenda for their tireless planning and time. This effort and dedication ensured that we were able to implement this mandated assessment seamlessly and safely.

- OPS Families for their communication, trust, openness, flexibility, and efforts in helping to ensure their students were at the testing location they needed to be on their schedule days/times.
- OPS Teachers and staff graciously offered their classroom spaces as testing sites. We couldn't have done this without their willingness to support this endeavor and let us take temporarily over their spaces.
- OPS Operations Department ensured that our testing spaces were secure and deeply cleaned after each assessment cycle. They also made sure we were stocked with extra cleaning and safety supplies.
- OPS Transportation Department worked with the ELL Planning Team to offer families a transportation option, if needed.
- As with all colleagues/buildings across the district, Hiawatha Staff has been working diligently to prepare and plan for our returning students. We welcomed our K-1 students back on Thursday, March 11th. It was very rewarding to see all of the intentionality and thoughtfulness in our plans come to fruition. There was palpable excitement from all - families, students, and staff. We are looking forward to welcoming our 2nd -4th graders today, Monday, March 15th.
