#### **Principal's Report - Tracy Ojerion**

- First Year at OPS, from 21 yrs education experience in Lansing (School Admin 6 years)
- Refresh of the library- student centered spaces created and no adult furniture
- New student support advisor (SSA: Mrs. Nikki Mann) "Caught being good" revamped, Wolf of the week program, recognizing students in every classroom per week, Assessed in Swiss system, decreased behavior intervention needs.
- Dr Slee- anti bias and anti racist study group, working on building personal awareness and understanding of culture. Working on the equity teams. Will start exploring stereotypes to be able to eliminate them.
- Letters training- teachers 13, 12 teachers work with Nicki for OG training
- 4<sup>th</sup> grade teachers: responsive classroom, bring positive culture into the classroom, morning and closing circles.
- Care Bear Project- supported 15 Cornell families during the holidays
- Field Trips- K go to Polka Patch, 4<sup>th</sup> to capitol, 3<sup>rd</sup> grade go to the Zoo
- Elementary Music- bringing back in person performance, 2 to happen in the spring (K-2 and 3-4) in May at the high school, 30 ukuleles sponsored and cabinet by the PTO (students also doing recorders)

#### Superintendent's Report John Hood

- District grant for nurses reviewing medication administration protocols, grant extended through 7/2024
- Grant to fund school resource officer at OHS, 3 years, 50% match from district, police hire and train them. Dr. Slee work with Jason Russell and Police Chief.
- Bond owners rep (Veritas), very helpful to manage the bond
  - o Summer projects: Secure vestibules BW, Edgewood, Central, Cornell
  - Refresh OPM (interior finishes doors, trim, office)
  - Planning Chippewa and Kinawa, some Cornell
- Calendar 23/24 posted on website: PLC days are no more, full days of PD attached to a Monday or Friday to allow long weekends because early release was a hardship for families.
- Union start and end dates to be announced this spring.
- Donations: Club donation (25K by a donor)

- Budget 9 HS clubs, 6 middle, 4 elementary school clubs, but actually many more clubs with just volunteer leaders.
- $\circ$   $\;$  More clubs such as D and D, Robotics, Affinity Groups
- Credit rating upgraded- lower rates for when we borrow (low debt, stable enrollments, and good admin to thank) AA stable, and longer term AA- stable
- PD topics TBA
- Changes to kick start days (device lines too long, to be addressed)
- Good language OG and letters training
- After school programs in all schools (K-12, Esser \$, COVID money)

# **QUESTIONS for Mr. Hood**

- Survey resent out to Chippewa regarding start of school time preferences (issue with announcement not getting to them originally), will be shared out in Feb, local sleep expert (parent) will talk to board and education
- School resource officer job: scope TBD, not uniformed, in the environment, armed, help deal with threats, not disciplinarians, will help with teaching how to interact with the police.
  - Concern: all think good and or marginalized populations think not a good idea. This is a budget add-on. Some districts are doing this. We need to come up with a process for discussion with parents and the community.
  - Question: PTAs role in school security? Jason Russell will come in next month to clarify security in the district. State level changes (for drills). Do we need a safety subcommittee at each school? How can the parent council be engaged?
  - Concern about each school having their own safety committees (one at Hiawatha currently, should others be doing this?), additional stuff done at one school and not another suggests some schools are safer than others inappropriately. Secure system being employed district wide soon.
- Percentage of Students involved in clubs? Getting that data.
  - Clubs? Can we add website similarities to find clubs at all levels? Mr Hood will look into this. Possibly new website- better interface district wide.

# Invited Speaker Stacey Bailey, Heather Pricco - Special Education

- Overview: Stacey Bailey, MI Integrated Continuous Improvement Committee
- Continuous, whole child, systems (EQUITY)
- MTSS framework, multi-tiered systems of support (Heather Pricco), rubric being created to assess this.
- Creating action plans, differentiated classroom instruction, switch to NWEA based on the subgroup previously, positive behavioral support (PBIS), meet Friday to look at review response, shared at Board meeting (academics, learning, and assessment calendars to be posted there)
- MTSS Diamond Model Tier 3, tier 2, tier 1, enrichment (remediation to acceleration)
- Heather Pricco- specially designed instruction for students with disabilities
- 2019: 436 with IEPS, current number is 562, in fall 2021 9.8% of our K-12 have IEPs,
- Supports ages 3-26, includes St. Martha's and Radmoor
- Increasing severe to moderate Autism, higher than anywhere else except Lansing.
- Social/Emotional concerns

- Full Spectrum- resource all buildings, speech and language therapy, social work, school psychologist, need to hire another Special Ed teacher.
- Early childhood Ed, ASD (OPM, K, OHS), Cognitive impairments (BW), emotional impairments (EI)
- Deaf, visually impaired ISD
- IEP Process: reviewed once a year, individualized plan, redetermine eligibility q 3 years, review data, new testing?
- Other things: awareness training for staff and students, present to classroom for student who is affected, staff at last PD day: autism presentation, Problem solving teams in every building, LINKS program OHS and Chippewa (2 class periods, elective class, one day a week in class with Special Ed learning about students with autism, and the second day they are in the gen ed supporting their peer with the disability)
- Special Ed Coach: OHS new this year, thanks to the Board
- One specialist 504 Plans, Other supports all building on a variety of things: behavior, self contained programs,
- Behavior K-8, psychologist and social worker, Gen ASD consultant.

## Questions

- 504 students are outside of Special Ed (not specialized education, just accommodations).
- MTSS data- how do you get that data? Stacey Bailey has this data, all students,
- Hiawatha- complicated IEP, communication? Admin person? How to choose the school? Did we have access to that?

Review process, Parents are not represented in the MTSS process, coming soon

- NWEA data- family reports that went home, some got it some didn't. No clear communication trail, when collected and having parents receive that information. More clear and timely reporting is needed for parents to be full allies.
- 504 kids- have needs that affect staffing, are you getting resources that you need? Need more staff?
- Each building has a point person. Principals at the elementary level.

## Jennifer Eddy - Gifted and Talented Program

- How identified? Fastbridge, NWEA, classroom performance (classroom proficiency, teacheridentified)
- FAdvocate for all, Consultant to all, PD to all, placement, academic programming, summer opportunities,
- 20-25% gifted/advanced. Website support materials for all teachers, extension, enrichment, and group projects. Eg. delve deeper of grade level vs pushing them ahead. 1.5 years ahead essentially.
- OPS summer school programs: Placement: math exit 3rd grade and literacy 4<sup>th</sup> graders
- Good fit and best fit groups.
- OSI (Okemos science institute) 2<sup>nd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> graders, Not during COVID, PLC days gone, so no time, highschoolers can't come over, if it comes back it is for ALL kids, can we do this during the school day.

• After spring conferences, she gives info to teachers to give out to students at spring conferences.

- Twice Exceptional: presentations to elementary staff, what it looks like, when it occurs, built into the day.
- Suggestion: Diamond image- arrow built into the enrichment to and from tier 1,2,3, since currently it doesn't account for inclusion of Twice Exceptional students
- 504- student input? Data/input gathered from middle schoolers up.
- Developing additional on-ramps for honors is great.
- Advanced math test- spring 4th grade skip 5<sup>th</sup> grade math and moved to 6<sup>th</sup> grade

# OPS Therapy Dog Presentation: Melissa Samluk, OHS teacher, Cece, 5.5 yr old golden retriever, Phoebe 1 yr old

- South Lyon therapy dog funded 4 dogs in schools there. Brighton also has therapy dogs.
- Cece is not a service dog. She is a therapy animal- trained in basic obedience, alliance for therapy dog certified.
- Therapy dog must be well tempered, well socialized, enjoy human touch, ten year working time.
- Lowers stress/anxiety and improves attendance.
- Goals: counseling center 1 hour, classroom visits
- Bring together different groups of kids.
- 23 districts in MI have therapy dogs.

- Phoebe, Chip, and Willow, and Cece,- FB and instagram.
- Allergies: dog free spaces, no one said dogs can't be in the classroom where kids are in OHS, need to assess in middle school and lower school.
- Zen den, no dogs (Muslim students go there to pray).
- \$10,000 cost for a trained therapy dog (often covered by sponsorships)
- PTA- ask for \$5000, and \$250-500 per year for incidentals.
- \$400 welcome kit includes beds, bowls, leash, toys, stick vacuum
- Insurance info???
- \$500 a year. MEETING WITH JOHN? Re asks, insurance,
- Jackson National- 501 C3 donate to PTOs for this?
- Website, Okemos Woof Pack, can accept donations (levels present), logowear
- Teachers and students benefit, especially on testing days
- Handlers, current staff, ten year commitment, application, grooming bills (goldendoodle more), Who pays? District pays, golden doodles Canine for Change take care of them and that place pays, now \$80 a visit
- Lottery for which elementary gets the dog next. 2 dogs for next year and 2 dogs for the year after.
- MSU Healthcare- interest, support from Mr Hood as it was similar to Sparrow, email the PTO presidents.
