Superintendent's Report

John Hood

- Introduced Mario Martinez Director Human Resources (1st day today).
 Came from Consumers Energy HR.
- Sextoration presentation at OHS last week. FBI Special Agent Christopher Rodolico. Problems often come from outside the US and often to young men/boys.
- Meridian Cares Event: Health and Safety Expo held last Wednesday. Trustee Cavannagh. Free gun locks.
- The School District will hold a legislative event, Jason Russell with representatives of Okemos. Not open to the public.
- Continuing to update the board on bond work. 1st approved: OPM refresh,

new lockers, secure vestibules and athletic field bids. New bathrooms with be male, female and gender neutral. Open sink areas to hallway. Starting work this summer. Locker rooms to include private stalls.

Donations for the next two therapy dogs have been received. One from Dean Bolton (Bolt), 2nd dog is Charlie. Looking for new businesses for sponsorship. https://www.okemoswoofpack.com/. Cornell and OPM still need therapy dogs. Joey's Outfitters provide food; Doggy Daycare and Spa provides free grooming. All Okemos Woof Pack gear goes back to woof pack care. The two new dogs are black labs.

Accessible playground issue brought to Board of Education. Budget planning is underway.

Kindergarten Roundup numbers coming in very low.

- OPS office opened once a week during summer for registration.
- School of Choice decisions made June 15, but cautious regarding adding need for new teacher (\$120,000 including benefits).
- Worksession tonight with board on next year priorities/policies
- Start Times changes not for next year.
- Budget surplus of 1 million this year but mindful of this surplus does not address teacher steps (\$900k), insurance, decreased enrollment, etc..
 - School budget finalized by end of June
 - State school budget significant increase on per pupil foundation. (\$9,200 per student)
 - Covid Grants: Textbooks, summer programs, counselors. Social workers, after school programs - How do we fund years ahead? Need to add to the budget.
- Start time survey follow up will be given to the board tonight (5/15) and communication to the public will follow.
- Snow Day issue at Cornell, board has given permission to not send kids back. OPS will pay a fine from the State of Michigan.

Board of Education Report

Andy Phelps

<u>Policy Update</u>: Board subscribes to policy service from Trune Law. Library of policies are available to use and make recommendations to suit our district. Over 200 policies need to be reviewed. Started with admin priorities, board operation procedures, gender identity, now to implement the rest. Community will need to review, and need a realistic timeline.

Budget - looking to make the best decisions for our District.

<u>Bond update</u> - under budget on Montessori, secure vestibules and athletic fields by 400K. www.okemosbond.net. End of summer for rough design on new Chippewa.

<u>Start Times</u> - Dr Hoffman (Okemos parent) has given definitive research on the delayed start times.

<u>School Resource Officer</u> - research on this intervention not overwhelmingly positive, community data is a mixed bag on this. Community support is good, not great. This will be a 215K budget ask.

<u>Security:</u> OPS is hosting a legislative event here because we are a model.

Cyndi Webster - School Libraries: Chippewa, Kinawa and Elementary LMC coordinator

Been with district since 2006. She has a Masters in Info/Library Sciences

- Access is biggest part.
- Library Bill of Rights
- Support from MASL, AASL, REMC (discount on resources) and of course
 OPS. OPS school policy reinforces principals that help guide our collections.
- Collection Development anyone has the right to question what is on the shelf and starts with conversation then formal review policy.
- 7 libraries (she gives support to all), but 1 OPS District Library. Under media tech department.
- Main goal is informational research for our students and staff and curation (make sure they come from good resources).
- Maker space area
- Received money for including more diversity in the library: collection catalog, shelving (gentrifying fiction collection), displays (reflective of community) and resources. Looking at our current catalog for bias.
- Holocaust storyteller (OEF, Michigan humanities)
- Online web page on district site
- Audiobooks: Have budget. PebbleGo supports elementary buildings purchased by district money.
- New furniture supporting all buildings in the district. (Each elementary got the same funds).
- New middle school buildings: A joint 5-8 library
 - Merging collections, 2 different genre setups, bell schedules, similar furniture (most pieces with go over), parent concern (age of collection and shared place. 2 classroom areas. Excited about the chance for a broader collection.
