<u>Welcome and Introductions</u> - Karen Shapiro - Everyone introduced themselves.

Superintendent's Report - John Hood

- Introduced Katie Diehl, Director of Safety and Security
 - 1st day on the job
 - Background: 25 Lansing Police Department, held many titles including IA/staff services/patrol captain/gang resistance instructor
 - This is a grant position and a response to the SRO discussion last school year. This is modeled as a best practice. Director Diehl will have a permanent office at OHS but gets started at Central Admin first.
 - The grant is for a 3 year period
 - Will be in charge of drills, threat assessments, and more
 - <u>Questions</u>:
 - Will an introduction letter be sent out to the OPS community? YES
 - How many MI districts have DSS? Detroit and maybe Grand Rapids
- Traffic Incidents There have been three involving students.
 - One here at Chippewa, one high school student (after hours) on bicycle on Okemos Rd, and one car hit our bus (refused to yield).
 - Working with the police chief on an education campaign and safety procedures.
 - Crosswalks will be repainted
 - A barrier will be place on the middle lane (which people use for passing)
 - Increased lighting on Hulett Rd.
 - Safe Route to School Group: MSU partners with 7 school districts. \$15K per school. We are already involved.
 - \$60K in engineering costs we are getting grants.
 - OPM has major Okemos Rd traffic issue but this a police department issue
 - Teaching kids to look up.
 - Guests Marna Wilson (Meridian Township) and Mark Polsfofer (County Commissioner) reached out to Sam Singh for \$60K to allow safe design work.
 - New permits for crosswalk signs
 - Possibly add crossing guard at Chippewa if they raise the age limit up.
- Ribbon-cutting at the stadium last week

- Secure vestibules almost done (Cornell and Bennett Woods new doors delayed due to materials delay). Hopefully will do November or Christmas break.
- Summer: breaking ground on new Chippewa. In 2 years Cornell kids move into Chippewa. 7 year total project.
- Senior Center is part of planning and working with Township. \$5M ARPA seed funds. Plan by 2024-12/31/2026. Can include gym, pickleball (multi-purpose center), warming/cooling center, etc. Located by Meridian Township municipal center.
- **Start Time Changes**: New committee with teachers, admin and partnets to figure out how to move forward. November will look at 2 approaches: flipping schedules or all grades starting later. Bargaining units will need to approve. By January.

Principal's Report - Interim Chippewa Principal Andre Ridley

- Took the group on a tour of the newly updated workout facility at Chippewa. Teaching safe way to work out.
- \$90 K worth of new equipment; free weights, benches, circuit machines, ellipticals, treadmills and exercise bikes.
- Gym open to all Chippewa students and hopefully a program for OPS staff.
- 8th grade Community Service food drive and field trip was a great success. 3 SUVs full of food donated to the food bank.
- After school parapro leading popular video game club

Guest Speaker - Kelly Bianchi, Operations

- Operations and Facility Rentals
- **Insurance** should not cost the PTOs a lot of money. Bennett Woods has a good, inexpensive policy (if others need a referral). (INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS HANDOUT)
- She can look at all the school policies: must have enough (\$1M coverage). She can look at it via email and PTOs can enter data online.
- Corrinne: Should we incorporate DPC? Centralize things like insurance? PTOs and Boosters Corinne and Mike will look into.
- At Cornell, one PTO person signs in and can have 2 followers the system.
- Booking Priorities: 1- School-related event, 2- Community Ed, 3- Other events
- Need to specify needs such as open doors, bathrooms, custodial help (tables, chairs clean-up, trash). Custodial help during the week is no charge. At the high school, events can piggy-back on each other for custodial staffing.
- Can upload license to sell food
- Can book one year in advance

- Board policy committee (with Katie C) will have adoption of new/updated policies by next school year (through Trune)
- Contracted out superintendent performance review
- Audit report received by Liz Lentz (glowing)
- Goal of aligning school board budget with community needs
