# Welcome and Introductions Liz Luyendyk

#### Superintendent's Report John Hood

Cornell principal interviews: involved students first time, parent, student teacher committee, candidate read a book to the class, down to two and checking references, hope to tell by Wednesday re-hire.

Gathering HS resumes for the principal.

Principals Hiring other positions for next year.

Review third party custodial contract- Peckham filling in January on. Contract bidding is out. Peckham will apply. They have done a good job. All more expensive

Food service- third party review of public school academies. Tough for Okemos and public school activities. Concerns: service okemos before service 3<sup>rd</sup> party school. We want to do more green initiatives and alternative foods, hard to do if Okemos isn't the focus. Now we have a new person, old person left to go to Howell where she loves the position there.

Mr Stierley- applied for a security grant.

New football Coach was introduced at the board meeting to great excitement.

Bond update next board meeting. Work session Tuesday.

Listening sessions with staff, Kinewa left and departments left.

Bond 2022- update to board, big items- new Cornell, and two new middle school buildings

After that, new Central OPM building (not on this bond proposal however).

COVID numbers ok, had to close a Cornell classroom last week.

Health Dept: schools don't have to contact trace. We are evaluating if we have to contact trace.

Capacity limits to be raised?

Science- curriculum, question as 4<sup>th</sup> grade teacher indicated there wasn't time for science as in the past due to other requirements. JMM to send Mr Hood more info.

COVID funds- they will make a webpage for transparency (June 13<sup>th</sup> will hear back)

Website UTD- was updated after the meeting

Zoom licenses on student devices? Not clear re next year

#### **Board of Education Report Andy Phelps**

First DPC meeting for Mr Phelps, indicated that this is a busy time for the board.

Bond is the primary issue. End of May recommendations are due. Defined "rocks": jar various size rocks analogy, \$270 million total dollars. Only a certain number of "big rocks" can fit, but also can fill in with medium and smaller rocks. Eg. Cornell, Kinewa, Chipeewa (\$210 million), secure vestibules (medium/small rocks). Dr. Slee equity update ongoing (end of June recommendation). Budget season (legislature hasn't passed a budget yet, but prelim numbers announced last meeting).

District calendar: contract negotiation topic. Prelim Mr Hood- board adopted a draft calendar. Checking full hours and days. ISD common calendar (on the website) for breaks, ingham winter and spring break. No flexibility all ingham county schools have to be aligned. Start and end date and other vacations are up to BW.

Steve- spring break for Ingham has moved forward a week (earliest it has ever been) because of state testing. ISD moved it.

? Other than SAT's testing, don't want to test them 4 days in a row. Window hard to assess unless you start at the start of the window

MSU's break is much earlier. So future alignment is unlikely.

# **Principal's Report Steven Stierley**

Kinewa Principal- Thanks for your participation

Retirements: Sarah Hudler 5<sup>th</sup> grade (>40 years), Joan Ferguson (k-12 tech corrdinator), Karen Carlson (Special Ed)

Planning for next year, hiring, state assessments, pride in meeting with all 4<sup>th</sup> grade teachers to get student info. Hand schedule all children to set up for success.

Testing currently 5<sup>th</sup> grade, 6<sup>th</sup> grade April 28 and May 5<sup>th</sup>.

FIELD TRIPS: with COVID numbers decreasing, field trips happening.  $6^{th}$  grade May  $3^{rd}$  Lugnuts game and May  $31^{st}$   $5^{th}$  grade students go,  $5^{th}$  graders also go to Greenfield village on the  $16^{th}$ .

Safety Grant: District wide, ballards? At OHS, \$50 k grant, waiting to see. Also applying for a safer route to school grant (sidewalks, put in bike lanes?, Kinewa drive replace turn lanes with walk areas).

Walking audit April 26<sup>th</sup>, asking community members to help walk the route. 1.5 miles. Look for Chippewa and Kinewa safe areas.

Previous bond: interactive board for all teachers- getting this summer. Kinewa- bids out for new lockers.

#### Questions?

Safe to school routes: MI Fitness Foundation and MSU, statewide, okemos resident heads it. CEO and IT are also okemos families. Grants are up to 400K between the two buildings.

New bond: how do safe routes work with new buildings being put up? All will be coordinated.

6<sup>th</sup> graders have done very well. Students are vocal about feelings and have adjusted very well in the year past COVID.

His being out on the road after school is helping with carline. Saves about 15-20 min.

At Chippewa there were issues starting M Step because the icon was not working- is that district wide? Yes, we had to cancel Tuesday testing and it was ok by Thursday. That was the DRC website.

# **Presentation Stephanie Gosha School Nurse**

December-March: Faith Lutheran Church 7-9 am COVID screenings and then close contact tracing with two others

Other projects: update medical action plans, started with Chippewa (better way so all info goes into powerschool? On the computer vs paper file),

- Any child with asthma, diabetes, seizures, allergies, heart conditions, etc need a medical action plan signed by a physician and in Powerschool.
- Review info on medical teams and training- if a child needs an epi pen, make sure all are trained.

Future vaccination clinics are being evaluated.

Updating communicable disease policies.

Reporting to the state, COVID testing, positives, closed classrooms etc.

Attending school nurse trainings

Medical plan linked to Powerschool (5<sup>th</sup> grade onwards parents can see this, see grades and attendance, lunch account money), it is in there as a scanned document. Required yearly. Must be updated by Oct 13<sup>th</sup>. Parents don't have access, teachers, principals, and nurses can access.

What if a child can't get to the doctor? Nut allergy will still treat a child if it is out of date. From Steve Stierly: if Medical needs meet with the family for a plan in place. Parents are the first call while the issue is occurring. Mr Hood indicated additional epi pens are at the schools if needed if no action plan is in place.

Systems: have you audited all the schools and access to sick rooms. She has not seen all of the sick rooms but she will do that. She has seen some epi pens have expired and has called parents.

If you weren't dealing with COVID what other projects would you be working on?

• She states she is new to school nursing. The state is giving her lists of to do items, updating the communicable disease policies next. Could include items in a newsletter. State and county updates the next action items for her.

Does the School nurse program coordinate with reproductive health program?

• Mr Hood states the school nurse has sat in on the committee, some years they are the same and some years they are different. Will coordinate in the future too.
